Haymarket's cheerful little **Rosso B pizzeria** (120 Blackstone St. at Hanover Street) has closed after a mere few months in business, owner Antonio Lucente-Stabile tells me. His restaurant's Facebook page once claimed to serve "Boston's best pizza"—and those crispy \$2 slices really were tasty. For now, Stabile has no plans to get back into the restaurant game.



Keith Schubert, affable owner of vegan food truck **Taco Party**, will bring tofu and tempeh tacos to Somerville's Ball Square this summer (711 Broadway at Boston Avenue). Schubert tells me that he'll open a 20-seat, counter-service restaurant with takeout, delivery, and an in-house bakery. "Having a restaurant will let me double the size of the menu and put back some of the items that people get mad when I take off," he says. Saber-tooth Vegan Bakery will provide sweets.



In other taco news, Alden & Harlow chef Michael Scelfo has opened Central Square's **Naco Taco** (297 Massachusetts Ave. at Village Street) with restaurateurs Alex Tanenbaum and Brian Lesser. On an unusual menu: offal and fried smelt tacos, crispy pigs' ear chilaquiles, and grilled carrot and smoked almond salsa.



One more taco tip: **Anna's Taqueria** will sell a Breslow burrito (grilled steak, cheese, rice, black beans, guacamole, and crumbled tortilla chips) for charity until the end of the month at each location. With every purchase, \$3 goes to Red Sox pitcher Craig Breslow's Strike 3 Foundation for childhood cancer research.

Fan Pier's **Committee** restaurant (50 Northern Ave. at Courthouse Way) is gearing up for a June opening. Greek chef, TV host, and cookbook author Diane Kochilas will help launch the Mediterranean spot. A rep says that beverage director Peter Szigeti will helm a drinks program that presents cocktails in a "theatrical way," so bottom's up. **KARA BASKIN**

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
